What is "Tenebrae"? Tenebrae, or "Shadows," is based on a twelfth-century late night/early morning service (30 to 40 minutes in length) and is an extended meditation on the passion of Christ using a variety of reading from the psalms, other Old Testament readings, as well as several from other sources. It is a meaningful prelude to the Triduum of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter.



The Great Vigil of Easter is perhaps the most important celebration of Holy Eucharist that we share in the Christian year. This year, the Easter Vigil service at Christ Church will take place in the garden at 7 p.m. on Holy Saturday (April 19th). All major parts of the service will be represented, although many of them in abbreviated form. We'll have refreshments (beer, wine, soda, etc) and hors d'oeuvres to share. Come celebrate this moment with your fellow Christ Church disciples, and help us to make this a night to remember.

Flowering of the Cross

On Easter Sunday, all children are invited to flower the cross beginning at 9:30 a.m. outside the parish hall doors. Any kids who wish to can then carry the cross in with the processional. The flowering of the cross represents the transition from Good Friday to Easter; from meditation on Jesus's death to joyful celebration of his resurrection. Covered with fresh, living flowers, the cross reminds us of the continuing presence of Christ today.
