From the Queen City to the Golden State: **Celebrating Catherine**

At the end of this month, we'll be saving goodbye to our brilliant and beloved Organist, Catherine, as she and her husband, Prawal, head off to California to begin an exciting new chapter together. It's a move full of possibilities for them—and while we're thrilled for what lies ahead, we're definitely going to miss her.

Catherine has been with Christ Church since 2017, hired by our former Director of Music, Dr. Allin Sorenson. From her very first Sunday, it was clear: she's the real deal. Whether leading us through a joyful hymn or adding just the right touch of magic to a quiet moment in the service, Catherine brings not just technical



skill, but deep musicality and heart to everything she plays. As one parishioner put it: "When Catherine is playing, our ears are listening and the whole church follows her lead."

What many folks might not know is just how hard Catherine has worked behind the scenes—not just musically, but academically and professionally. Over the past few years, while never missing a single rehearsal or service, she's been pursuing her RN degree, which she completed with highest honors and flying colors. And if that weren't impressive enough, Catherine has spent many Saturday nights working overnight nursing shifts. That means she clocks out at 7am and comes straight to church to play for our Sunday services. It's the kind of grit and commitment that leaves you in awe. Catherine is, simply put, a force.

And beyond the music? Catherine's been a joy to work with. As a conductor, having an organist who just gets it—who can anticipate, adapt, and elevate what we do together—is a dream. That's been our partnership from day one. We've shared a lot of laughter, a lot of coffee-fueled rehearsals, and more than a few "Did you read my mind just now?" moments. It's been a collaboration I'll always treasure.

The kids have loved her too—whether she was accompanying the St. Cecilia Choir or encouraging young singers during rehearsals, she's been a steady and supportive presence for our youngest musicians. Her kindness and professionalism have left an impression on all of us. Another parishioner put it perfectly: "I always know when Catherine is gone. She never misses a beat?" One musician recalls Catherine as "...an exceptionally generous and gifted soul..."



Trouble Hearing? Our Hearing Devices May Help

For our members who may be hearing impaired, I wanted to take a moment and remind you of something that could help. At the back of the Nave, and just before you enter the side doors, we have two plastic containers full of our Listen devices. These radio devices are synced with our sound system and may help you better hear the services.

In the containers, there are batteries and over-the-ear headphones you can use. You are welcome to bring your own set of headphones to use as well. Simply place a set of batteries inside the front of the device and turn the volume wheel to the right to turn the device on. If you need help, please ask one of our parishioners, ushers, or our sexton Will to assist. When finished, please remove the batteries (so they don't corrode the Listen devices) and place them back in one of the plastic containers when finished.
