Music & Youth Ministry Highlights

Choirs: The St. Gregory and St. Cecilia Choirs continue to raise the bar week by week. Aside from incorporating general music fundamentals into rehearsals, singers are empowered through their musical excellence and leadership – frequently performing a diverse canon of music that is engaging, educational, and spiritually enriching. We continue our work of instilling a love of music and its role in the worship experience. Special opportunities have included celebrating Fr. Joe's Installation, a Fall Concert, World Communion Day, Students at the Symphony, Advent Lessons & Carols, caroling at The Fremont Senior Living and Mercy Chapel, two Christmas Eve services, and ending the year with Christmas Lessons & Carols. Several of our choristers including Choral Scholars and St. Cecilia members were featured soloists. Macioce Handbell Choir: Under the direction of Mary Christiano, the Handbell Choir (recently renamed the Macioce Handbell Choir in honor of the late Jean Macioce – former children's choir director) played three handbell preludes at the 10am service celebrating (1) Pentecost, (2) Thanksgiving, and (3) Advent!

Concert Series: We continue to architect a Concert Series to amplify our musical offerings and foster community with outside artists. In August, we hosted the Springfield Community Jazz Ensemble which featured a packed out Parish Hall, delicious BBQ, and several toe-tapping melodies. In December, we hosted the MSU Chorale, the flagship choral ensemble of the University. With a standing-room-only Nave, the Chorale performed works spanning centuries and truly helped ring in the holiday spirit. I was so appreciative of the many CEC folks that joined us for these events. I owe a special word of gratitude to our Hospitality Committee who always go above-and-beyond to help our guests feel welcomed, fed, and loved. I have lots of exciting plans for 2024 - stay tuned!

Youth: Our Youth Group STAYS active and engaged! We continue to nurture and challenge our teens by fostering an environment of inclusivity, togetherness, and love. Weekly lessons have covered a variety of topics including: The Book of Job, Mental Health Awareness, LGBTQ+ History Month, All Saints' Day, Homelessness Awareness Month, Advent 101, and more! Special events have included: Laser Tag in the church, Southern Deanery Youth Game Night, Parking Lot Fundraiser, Outreach at Council of Churches, Diocesan Convention in KC, Students at the Symphony, Shopping for Ambassadors for Kids, Caroling at The Fremont Senior Living and Mercy Chapel, our annual Christmas Party, and trip to Silver Dollar City! January Outreach

Every winter, the Community Partnership of the Ozarks opens overnight Crisis Cold Weather Shelters (CCWS) in Springfield to provide additional emergency shelter beds. CCWS are open November 1st through March 31st on nights when temperatures reach 32 degrees or lower. During the 2022-2023 winter, Crisis Cold Weather Shelter sites were open 60 nights and provided 10,657+ bed nights. These shelters save lives and would not be possible without the dedication of the host sites themselves, countless community volunteers who compassionately give of their time.

A meal is provided each evening at Grace Methodist Church and, if shelters are open that night, bus transportation is available to take persons to the shelters.

Volunteers are greatly needed. There are many opportunities to serve. You could spend the night at the shelter, provide transportation, wash bedding and more. The website (www.cpozarks.org/ccws) provides more information.

And, as always, money is needed to support these activities. If donating by check through the church, please note: Cold Weather Support in the memo line.



Vestry Nominations for 2024

Christ Church is accepting names for the 2024 Vestry openings. There will be <u>five positions</u> open at the end of January 2024. **Vestry terms are three years.** According to church canon, nominees must be: at least 16 years-old and confirmed communicants in good standing; and loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Episcopal Church. In addition, in this parish, nominees must be: financial contributors of record for at least one year, in church, and committed to tithing as the minimum standard of Christian giving or working faithfully toward the giving a tithe; regular in church attendance and committed to monthly vestry attendance; active in the work of at least one committee or ministry of the church, in addition to Vestry; committed to functioning according to the norms established by the Vestry; prepared to attend a Vestry orientation by the Rector, as well as an annual vestry Training Day with the Bishop.

An ideal Vestry is one that features people of diverse backgrounds who fully represent our church community. We'd like to make sure that we have representation from each Sunday service and a good mix of people. Members of the same family may not serve on Vestry at the same time. All Vestry members should be united by their commitment to Christ and service to him. If you believe God is calling you to this ministry, or if you know of someone who would be a faithful Vestry member, please get that person's permission to nominate them, and then complete the form on the back page and submit it to the church office as soon as possible, or email the information requested below to frontoffice@christepiscopalchurch.com. All qualified nominees will appear on the slate at the church's Annual Election and Meeting on Sunday, February 4.
